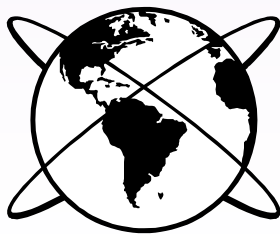

Todd Felty is going into his 7th year as Director of Bands for the Eustace Independent School District. Prior to coming to Eustace Mr. Felty was the director in Cross Plains, Tx., where the band enjoyed many successes including twice qualifying for the Area UIL Marching contests, Mr Felty also taught in Winters, McCamey, Crosbyton and Ranger. A graduate of Texas Tech University with a Bachelors and Masters degree in Music Education, Mr Felty has 23 years of teaching experience in Texas schools and is a Member of the Association of Texas Small School Bands, Texas Bandmasters Association and Texas Music Educators.

Mr. Felty is married to Eustace Kindergarten Teacher Twyla Felty and has 4 children Megan, Danielle, Jake and Josh. All of the family members are musical and participate in band.

Chad Bentley is proudly beginning his music education career here at his Alma Mater Eustace High School as the low brass and percussion instructor. Working as a student teacher he will finalize his Bachelors degree in music education on December 15th, from Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, Louisiana. Upon receiving his degree he will assume responsibilities as an assistant director here at Eustace beginning full time in January. He has had the privilege of teaching a number of honor music camps at N.S.U. and various marching band camps in the East Texas and Louisiana areas. Due to the leadership skills gained from Eustace he has been able to step up as section leader for the “*Spirit of Northwestern*” Demon Marching Band and sit as the principle tuba player for the Northwestern Wind Symphony

for three of his four years in attendance at the university. In addition, he has also been a member and principle tuba player for the Natchitoches-Northwestern Symphony and the *Sinfionitachi* Brass Quintet for two years at the university. The past two years he has been asked by university brass professors to sit in with chamber ensembles which included members of the Shreveport Symphony.

When he is not teaching, he enjoys playing local shows with his band and hanging out with his friends while enjoying life. He is happy to be here at Eustace and looks forward to seeing students succeed day to day and carry that success into the future.

Patricia Williams is a graduate of Henderson State University in Arkadelphia, Ar. She has 22 years in music education. This will be Mrs. Williams second year in Eustace ISD. Prior to coming to Eustace, Mrs. Williams taught in Kemp, Clyde, and Redwater, Tx. She is a member of Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, and the Association of Texas Small School Bands. Mrs. Williams was named 2004 Teacher of the Year in Kemp, Tx.
