

Government/ Economics

In Government, the focus is on the principles and beliefs upon which the United States was founded and on the structure, functions, and powers of government at the national, state, and local levels. Students will analyze major concepts of republicanism, federalism, checks and balances, separation of powers, popular sovereignty, and individual rights, and compare the U.S. system of government with other political systems. Students will also analyze the importance of individuals, political parties, interest groups, and the media on the American political system, evaluate the importance of voluntary individual participation in a democratic society, and analyze the rights guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution.

In Economics, the focus is on the basic principles concerning production, consumption, and distribution of goods and services in the United States and a comparison with those in other countries around the world. Students will examine the rights and responsibilities of consumers and businesses. Students will also analyze the interaction of supply, demand, and price and study the role of financial institutions in a free enterprise system.

Heather Holloway

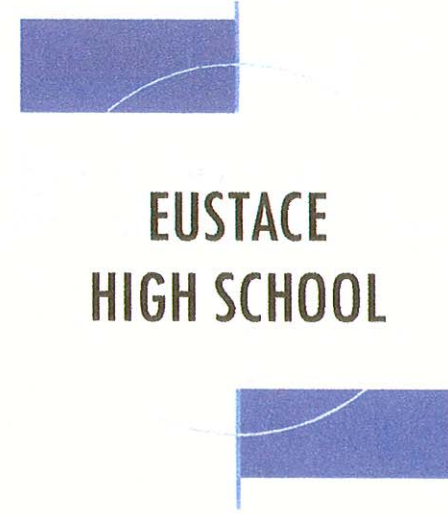
Mrs. Holloway received her B.A. from UT-Dallas in 2005. This is her second year of teaching. She will be teaching World History and Algebra I.
