2006-2007 Course Offerings

Accounting I - A I credit course that teaches how to implement personal and interpersonal skills to strengthen individual performance in the workplace and in society and to make a successful transition to the workforce and/or postsecondary education. Students apply technical skills to address business applications of emerging technologies. Students develop a foundation in the economical, financial, technological, international, social, and ethical aspects of business to become competent consumers, employees, and entrepreneurs.

BCIS I - A I credit cluster course designed to provide a foundation of basic concepts while providing hands-on skills related to microcomputer systems and applications. Special emphasis is placed on basic skills for the following: word processing, database, spreadsheet, presentations, desktop publishing, Internet, integrated software, and social implications of using computers.

BCIS II - A I credit cluster course designed to provide an advanced level of those basic concepts learned in BCIS I. Emphasis is placed on the following: word processing, database, spreadsheet, presentations, desktop publishing, internet, integrated software, and social implications of using computers.

Multimedia - A I credit cluster course designed to provide a foundation of basic concepts while providing hands-on skills related to microcomputer systems and applications. Special emphasis is placed on basic skills for the following: presentations, desktop publishing, internet/web, design, digital graphics, and social implications of using computers.
